

AMENDED NOTE

State Impact

Implementation of this bill will require \$338,100 from the Commerce Service Fund. Most of first year costs (\$250,000) is for document processing fees to the vendor. (Fee is assumed to be \$1) The vendor will bear costs of developing the database. Also part of first year costs is an additional FTE at a cost of \$63,100 and the Attorney General will need \$25,000 in the first year to help with rulemaking. While first year costs come from the Commerce Service Fund, fees would be set at a level so that the fund is repaid and continuing project costs are self funded. Spending from the Commerce Service Fund could affect revenue available to the General Fund.
